Graduation Requirements

Students successfully completing the requirements listed, with a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.00 will be awarded an Esthetician Certificate.

The overall objective is to prepare students for careers in the diversified areas of skin care including the use of cosmetics. Students will be given a thorough understanding of both theory and practice in areas dealing with skin care.

Admission Requirements

High school diploma with a minimum 50% in:

- Grade 12 English
- Grade 12 Science - Biology 30 preferred

Graduation Requirements

Students completing the requirements with a minimum GPA of 2.00 will be awarded a Certificate in Massage Therapy.

The Massage Therapy Certificate program provides an opportunity for students to acquire the knowledge and skills needed to pursue a career in the massage therapy industry. The course content teaches occupation specific and employability skills. Having the opportunity to practice in a clinical environment allows students to develop the skills necessary to be a practicing Massage Therapist in the Province of Alberta.

Included in the course content is the opportunity to earn a First Aid and CPR Certificate.

This program is a recognized prerequisite for the Alberta Therapy Admissions Examination (AMTAE), which qualifies students for membership in the Alberta Registered Massage Therapist Society (ARMTS). The certificate also qualifies students for membership in the Association of Massage Therapists and Holistic Practitioners (AMTWP). Graduates are also eligible to apply for the entry examination with the Massage Therapists Association of Alberta (MTAA).

Lakeland College's Massage Therapy program is a member in good standing with the Canadian Council of Massage Therapy Schools and has agreed to abide by CCMTS bylaws and policies.

Pharmacy Technician - Retail

Admission Requirements

A high school diploma (or mature status) with a combined average of at least 60% in:

- Grade 12 English
- Grade 12 Math

It is recommended that applicants be proficient in Microsoft Office computer applications.

A criminal record check is required, and is requested through the RCMP. Based on the information received, students may be denied entrance into the program.

The cost of a criminal record check varies among detachments.

Graduation Requirements

Students who successfully complete the program requirements with a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.00 will be awarded a Certificate of Achievement in Pharmacy Technician - Retail.

The Pharmacy Technician - Retail is comprised of a theory portion designed in a self-study format, combined with lab and practicum time. The self-study program is supported with class and laboratory days throughout the 14 weeks. It requires minimal classroom time to cover essential program content, making it well suited to those working part-time or facing child-care challenges. Concurrent with the theory, students will attend eight hours on the weekend and three hours on a weeknight evening. The final four weeks (160 hours) of the program are spent on the job (unpaid) at an approved retail pharmacy. The practicum allows graduates to develop the necessary manual skills, technical knowledge and clinical experience required on the job. Wherever possible, the program simulates a work environment and works to develop workplace skills and professional standards.

Practical Nurse

Admission Requirements:

- High School Diploma
- 60% in English 30 (70% in English 33)
- 50% in Math 20 or 60% in Math 20 Applied
- 60% in Biology 30
- Minimum 18 years of age
- Clear Criminal Record Check including the Vulnerable Sector Check (within 3 months of program start date)
- Statement of good physical and mental health (Health Status Form)
- Personal Interview will be required as well as a letter of intent
- TOEFL 560/220 if English is your second language

Applicants will be invited to attend an orientation session with program staff.

Applicants must provide evidence of the following immunization requirements:

- Diphtheria/Tetanus. Dates of Primary Series and Booster within past 10 years.
- Varicella. History of chicken pox disease. If no history or uncertain of chicken pox history, Titre required. If Titre is negative, vaccine is required.
- Measles/MMR. Persons born before 1970 are considered immune. Persons born after 1970 should have 2 doses of measles/MMR vaccine.
- Rubella. Date of Rubella vaccine or positive Rubella Titre.
- Tuberculin Test. Annual One or Two step skin testing, unless known positive.
- Hepatitis B. *Series of 3 doses must be started before registration (follow up Titre must be done 1-6 mths after third dose)
- Polio - Dates of Primary Series

Graduation Requirements

Students completing the requirements listed will be awarded a Diploma in Practical Nursing from NorQuest College/Lakeland College.

Lakeland College, in conjunction with NorQuest College, offers the Practical Nurse program. This program educates individuals in the health and wellness field. The Practical Nurse works co-operatively with members of the health care team in the promotion, maintenance and restoration of health. It provides the opportunity for students to acquire knowledge to meet service sector needs for practice as a Licensed Practical Nurse.

This program prepares students to write the National Practical Nurse Examination to obtain a license to practice practical nursing in acute care hospitals, continuing care centres, client homes, clinics, or doctors' offices.
