

NFPA 1002 - Fire Department Vehicle Driver/Operator Professional Qualifications

A fire department vehicle contains an array of sophisticated apparatus. With this training learn how to make the most of its capabilities—and yours. Excellent skill development for general firefighters and pump operators, and an opportunity to cross-train personnel as backup to vehicle operators.

Pump Operator B

ID #2-PU \$660

This is a 36-hour classroom and practical course includes relay, tandem and dual pumping; portable pumps; apparatus service tests; and, hydraulic calculations used in the fire service. Also learn about the flow of water through large diameter hose, and single- and double-hose lays.

Aerial Apparatus

ID #3-PU \$670

The theory and practical components of this 32-hour course include types and construction of aerial apparatus, hydraulic systems on aerial devices and apparatus, operating, positioning and stabilizing aerial apparatus, strategies and tactics, elevated master streams, and aerial apparatus testing.

Evaluation: practical evaluation, proctored written exam

Specific requirement: a valid driver's licence with airbrake endorsement.

NAPD Driving

ID#1-NAPD \$400

This two-day course includes both lectures and hands on driving. The NAPD driving course has proven to decrease accidents and provide a safer driver environment for emergency response personnel. Included in this course are: laws of nature, vehicle safety checks, cornering techniques, hydroplaning, reading the road and accident avoidance.

Upon completion of this program you will receive a Certificate from the National Academy of Professional Driving.

Evaluation: written exam and practical evaluation

Prerequisites: Minimum 18 years of age. Class 5 licence. (Class 3 with air brakes preferred).
