- IMPORTANT:**
1. All horse owners must attend the first Rodeo Club meeting of every month – Monday's at 6:00 pm. Attendance will be taken.
 2. Due to limited space, a priority list will be established by the Equine and Rodeo Operations Manager. The Manager has the right to designate and change penning/stalling throughout the year. Priority will be given to students competing on the Rodeo Team.
 3. No stallions will be admitted.
 4. At any time throughout the year, the Equine Manager has the right to move or isolate any horse if the safety or health of that horse or a surrounding horse is jeopardized.
 5. Any owner(s) of a horse that is showing signs of neglect or malnourishment will be asked to remove the horse from College property.
 6. This is an application. Horses must be accepted before arrival. **Not all applications will be accepted.**
 7. Applications must be in by **August 1**. Applying early will not give you priority. Late applications will be at the bottom of the priority list.
 8. Any horse hurt or injured on Lakeland College property is not the responsibility or a liability of Lakeland College or the Lakeland College Rodeo Club.
 9. There is no individual penning for horses. **New for 2011/2012**, there will be no large turnout pen. All horses must be fed by their owner daily.

**LAKELAND COLLEGE RODEO CLUB BARN
RENTAL AGREEMENT**

I, _____, agree to the following:

1. The Rodeo Club Barn is to be kept neat and clean. Failure to do your share of the clean-up will cause you to lose your stall.
2. No smoking or drinking allowed in the barns. No drinking in the arena unless at a licensed function.
3. Manure is to be dumped in designated areas, NOT IN FRONT OF THE DOORS!
4. Keep all tack locked up to the best of your ability. (Tack boxes are only available to horses that are accepted into the Rodeo Barn stalls, 34 stalls = 34 tack boxes.)
5. Park horse trailers in designated areas.
6. Keep all the alleys swept and clean at all times.
7. Put tools away after use, that is, manure carts, forks, etc.
8. Keep tack rooms clean. Limited space for tack is available on a first come, first served basis for students that do not have a stall in the Rodeo Barn.
9. Hay is very expensive, so please DO NOT WASTE HAY. If you waste the hay, your rent will go up accordingly.
10. Stalls should be cleaned daily by 10:00 am. If stall is not kept clean, you will lose your stall privileges.
11. Being allowed in the Rodeo Club Barn is a privilege. This means volunteering to help out regularly. Failing to help the Rodeo Club when called upon can also cause you to forfeit your stall. Remember, a lot of students applied for your stall, so look after it!
12. Rent is to be paid at the beginning of September and January. You pay for the first semester in September and the second in January. A \$100 refundable deposit cheque made out to Lakeland College and post-dated to **April 15, 2012** is required by each student. This deposit cheque is not cashed and will be voided in April provided there has been no damages incurred. Tie stalls cost \$500 per semester and box stalls cost \$700 per semester. A turn out pen and feed is included in stall prices. The price for feed and a pen without a stall is \$400 per semester.
13. Students must pay for the full semester. Even though your horse may go home early in December or early in April, you must pay for the full term. This will allow the Rodeo Club to keep the rent down.
14. Rodeo Team members with a CIRA membership can bring an additional horse at a monthly rate of \$125 per month.
15. Failing to understand any of these rules will not be accepted as an excuse.

LAKELAND COLLEGE HEALTH PROTOCOLS FOR HORSES BOARDING ON CAMPUS

1. No stallions will be admitted onto campus.
2. All horses *must* have had the following vaccinations and required boosters (if necessary). Proof of purchase or a vaccine certificate must be shown upon arrival:

_____ 3-way Vaccination – Eastern, Western Encephalitis, Tetanus
_____ Equine Influenza and Equine Rhinopneumonitis (optional)
_____ Strangles (intranasal vaccine)

West Nile vaccine is recommended, but not required.

All horses must be dewormed **after** August 15, 2011, and prior to arrival on campus – proof of purchase must be shown.

Follow-up vaccinations and deworming must be done throughout the year at the student's own cost. Students are responsible for maintaining adequate health care for their horse. This includes hoof care, dental care, and any other necessary veterinary care as needed.

It is expected that all horses on the Lakeland College campus will receive immediate veterinary care if needed. It is the student's responsibility to arrange for health care for their horses from the local veterinary clinics.

If your horse shows signs of infectious disease such as:

- Thick nasal discharge
- Cough
- Swelling under the jaw

Notify the Equine and Rodeo Operations Manager immediately, and the horse should be isolated from all other horses.
